Plumas Ski Club's 10th annual Redstreak Snowball will be held

Saturday Feb. 2, 2002 at Longboard's Bar and Grill in Graeagle CA. The Snowball began ten years ago as a fundraising celebration to help the Plumas Ski Club operate the lifts at the constantly struggling Plumas Eureka Ski Bowl. It was originally held in November or early December to help pay for the fuel delivery that would power the aging Poma Lifts in January, February, and March. This would once again allow the club to continue the long tradition of downhill skiing in the Johnsville area. As the years went by, costs continued to go up, equipment continued to break down, many skiers went somewhere else to ski, and the Plumas Ski Club finally gave in to the increasing financial burden and sold the improvements on "the hill."

The Plumas Ski Club has not given up on its mission of promoting skiing in the High Sierra. We continue to meet regularly, and are still actively involved in many local programs. We currently organize and promote annual longboard races including the Historic Longboard Revival Series, help sponsor the Johnsville Jr. Ski Program, support Feather River College Ski Programs including new longboard production, organize and co-sponsor a Saturday Ski Program and other weekend ski trips, and are exploring new backcountry ski options.

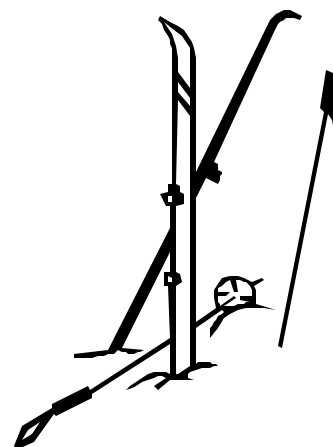
March 9th and 10th - Clair Tappan Warming Hut

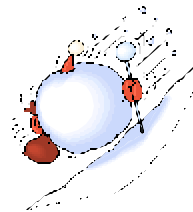
